

Towards Smarter Destinations: Use Case in Blue Tourism

Challenges and Opportunities for the Smart Destination Platform (PID) on the Coast. BLUE TOURISM USE CASE

The PID, promoted by SEGITTUR and the Ministry of Industry and Tourism, has already been published and is being implemented in multiple Spanish destinations. This roundtable discussion will focus on the practical application of the PID to Blue Tourism and coastal municipalities, analysing the initial progress, case studies and lessons learned during its deployment.

Representatives from pioneering destinations and technology companies will demonstrate how the PID is facilitating better local-level tourism planning through data interoperability, systems integration, and evidence-based decision-making. Governance, sustainability, and infrastructure serving the coastline and its communities

Large ports of general interest are set to play a key role in the sustainable transformation of Europe's coastline. This round table will bring together port authorities, major shipping companies, and municipal representatives to discuss how to move toward a port model that is fully integrated into its environment, aligned with climate objectives, improving coastal livability, and meeting the new demands of international tourism.

From the electrification of docks (OPS) to the integration of renewable energies and smart grids, the role of cruise terminals as energy hubs and their direct impact on the quality of life in port cities will be analyzed. The challenges and opportunities of collaborative port-city governance, where economic, urban, and environmental interests converge in a single strategy, will also be addressed.

In addition, there will be a discussion on how these ports can become strategic allies in promoting cleaner, more connected blue tourism that is compatible with municipal objectives in terms of sustainability, urban planning, and social cohesion.

Living Resources, Invasive Algae, and Circular Solutions

From natural hazard to economic opportunity

The proliferation of invasive algae such as Rugulopteryx okamurae on the Andalusian coast and other areas of the Mediterranean currently represents a major environmental, tourism, fishing, and economic challenge. Its impact is felt directly on beaches, artisanal fishing, and the quality of the landscape, affecting local development and the tourist experience in coastal municipalities.

This round table proposes to address this issue from a blue circular economy perspective, promoted by municipalities and aligned with the Andalusian Strategy for a Sustainable Blue Economy, which clearly envisages the valorization of marine biomass as an engine for development. Through dialogue between affected municipalities, start-ups, administrations, and European experts, innovative solutions will be presented to transform this threat into biofuels, natural fertilizers, regenerative materials, or new industries linked to the blue bioeconomy.

Destination Tourism Sustainability Plans: Andalusia in Action

From plans to the real transformation of coastal destinations

Andalusia is leading the way in Spain by implementing Destination Tourism Sustainability Plans (PSDTs), turning them into effective tools for territorial transformation. From Cádiz to Granada, Almería and Huelva, Andalusian municipalities are implementing projects that integrate the four pillars of the Andalusia 2030 Tourism Sustainability Strategy: green and digital transition, territorial cohesion, innovation and governance.

This roundtable discussion will bring together representatives from municipalities that are already developing PSDTs, including Bolonia (Tarifa, Cádiz), Almuñécar (Granada) and Huelva, as well as towns on the Almería coast. Also present will be representatives from the Regional Government of Andalusia and stakeholders from the regional tourism ecosystem. Through sharing their experiences, they will demonstrate tangible results such as urban regeneration of the coastline, reduction of environmental impact, modernisation of infrastructure, improvement of accessibility, and creation of jobs linked to the blue economy.

PSDTs have established themselves as an effective local development tool, strengthening the competitiveness of destinations and improving the well-being of citizens. They align municipal objectives with the European Green Deal, Next Generation EU funds, and the Andalusian Strategy for a Sustainable Blue Economy.


